This coming week we will enter the most sacred week of the Church’s liturgical year: **Holy Week**. At the climax of this week, we will celebrate the Sacred Tridium, three days that form a single feast: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. Most of us think of these days as three separate feasts, each independent of the other. But nothing could be further from the truth. The Sacred Tridium of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil form a single feast whereby we participate in the Paschal Mystery of Christ’s death and resurrection.

Rosary for children continues every Monday at 3pm in the church baptistry. A special invitation for grandparents to join us with their grandchildren. Everybody welcome.

On Palm Sunday, we enter into the journey of Jesus who gives us His Body and Blood, who carries His cross, who lies in the cavern of the dead, and who opens the doors of death for us. As the Lord goes on His saving way, He calls young men to the Sacred Priesthood to hold up His Body, to be bearers of His Precious Blood, to show the world His saving Cross, to tell all of His promise of life over death. Become His Priest and open the way to God for others.
